CALL FOR PROPOSALS: VOCATIONAL TRAINING PARTNERS TO ADVANCE LOCAL SKILL SET EDUCATION FOR YOUNG PEOPLE IN LOS ANGELES, CA.

WURWAND FOUNDATION GOALS AND OBJECTIVES

Wurwand Foundation is pleased to announce a new grant opportunity aimed at supporting nonprofit organizations that provide direct training and education in a variety of skill sets to young people in Los Angeles.

As the demand for skilled labor continues to rise, skill set training has become a powerful pathway to financial independence, economic mobility, and long-term career stability. From health care, to skin therapy, aesthetics and barbery, to construction, welding, automotive repair and other hands-on professions, skill set training offers individuals - particularly those from underrepresented or underserved communities - the opportunity to build meaningful careers and, in many cases, to launch their own businesses.

By investing in organizations that deliver high-quality, accessible training, we aim to empower individuals to *learn how to do something* and gain the necessary skills to build successful futures.

REQUIREMENTS

Skill Set Training grants will be up to \$75,000 for a one-year pilot to help us get to know the organizations and their work before potentially establishing longer-term, multi-year grants.

These grants aim to support <u>direct training programs</u> for <u>post-secondary career</u> <u>pathways</u> that meet the following criteria:

- The program provides direct training aligned with real career opportunities at low- or no-cost to clients.
- The program is happening in the Greater Los Angeles area.
- The program puts participants on a path to living wage, sustainable careers with growth potential.
- The program provides support services to overcome hurdles.

SKILL SET AREAS FOR CONSIDERATION

All direct training skill set training programs in high demand industries may be considered. This includes but is not limited to:

- Salon, Aesthetics, and Personal Services Trades: Including barbery, cosmetology, esthetics, etc.
- Healthcare Trades: Including nursing and home health care, etc.
- Building Trades: Including but not limited to carpentry, masonry, electrical, plumbing, sheet metal, HVAC, framing, and painting.
- Welding: Including but not limited to Stick, Flux, MIG, TIG welding certification and job ready skills and abilities.

WHO SHOULD APPLY

- Nonprofit organizations with 501(c)3 tax-exempt status from the IRS
- Nonprofits with programs operating within the Greater Los Angeles region
- Programs serving participants AGES 16-24
- Programs that do *not* limit participation to specific groups
- Programs that provide direct skills training to participants
- Programs that have engaged in their specific type of training for at least one year and have data to demonstrate efficacy
- Programs that *include* job placement support for participants.

WHO SHOULD NOT APPLY

- Individuals
- Intermediary organizations
- For profit entities, including start-up small businesses
- Programs that do not provide on-site training
- Programs that contract with separate organizations to provide direct training
- Organizations that discriminate in any way
- Religious organizations, unless engaged in programs that are non-sectarian, benefit a broad base of the community, and have a separate 501(c)3 designation
- Political action committees, candidates, causes, or lobbying organizations
- Labor, alumni, or fraternal groups

GRANT TIMELINE

- August 11, 2025: Interest Form opens
- September 12, 2025: Interest Forms due
- Week of September 15, 2025: Organizations invited to submit full applications
- October 24, 2025: Final applications due
- Week of October 27, 2025: Finalists selected and notified
- Week of November 10, 2025: Site & Zoom visits conducted for finalists
- Week of December 1, 2025: Grant Awards Communicated

Wurwand Foundation reserves the right to accept or reject ALL proposals. To be considered for funding, organizations must first complete the Interest Form on www.wurwandfoundation.org to express their interest in applying for the grant. Late forms will not be accepted. Every Interest Form will be thoroughly reviewed. Interest forms that do not meet the eligibility criteria will not be considered for invitations to apply for the grant.

Organizations will then be invited to apply for the grant, at which time instructions and application form will be sent. Organizations MUST be invited to apply.

We respectfully ask that organizations refrain from reaching out directly via phone or email regarding funding.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

How do organizations apply for funding?

Organizations MUST be invited to apply for funding. In order to be invited to apply, they must complete the Interest Form on www.wurwandfoundation.org. Interest Forms are due on Friday, September 12, 2025. Late submissions will not be considered. Once an organization has been invited to apply for funding, they will be sent the instructions and application materials via email.

What is the grant selection process?

Once organizations are invited to apply, information regarding the process will be made available.

What is the invitation-to-apply process?

Interest Forms are evaluated during a review process to ensure programs align with the grant focus. Decisions to invite or decline to invite organizations to apply are made at the sole discretion of the Wurwand Foundation and are final.

What will the amount of the grants be?

It depends on the size and scope of the work, but the total grant amount per organization should not exceed \$75,000. Please include the amount of funding requested in the application.

How long will grants be?

Up to one year for any new partnerships.

How many applicants do you expect to fund?

Between 1-4 organizations.

How will the grant amount be determined?

The size of each grant will depend on the size of the organization's overall budget, the project budget, and the amount of funds available.
